WHY PAY MORE?

The Big Red Computer Club has a large library of public domain, freeware, and shareware Apple software. For as little as \$2.50 per disk, you can obtain copies of these programs. This provides an inexpensive and easy way to add programs to your personal software library.



3.5" Disks: The disk volumes listed on pages 3 through 20 of this catalog are 3.5" disk volumes. All of the programs on these disks are for the Apple IIGS owners. Most of the disks contain several different programs. You will need 1.25 Megs of memory and System 5.0.4 or higher to run the programs. Most of the disks do not include the GS operating system. You must first boot the GS system disk before you can use many of the programs. Some of the programs are hard drive installable and others are not. Desk accessories and Inits must be installed on your System Disk before you can use them. A few of the games require a joystick.

Copying Charge: There is a charge for all copies made from the software library. This fee, which includes the cost of the blank disk, helps cover the costs of maintaining and upgrading the library. If you order from 1 to 9 disks, the price per disk is \$3.50. For an order of 10 or more disks, the price drops to \$2.50 per disk. Add \$3 per order for shipping and handling to addresses within the United States and Canada.

TECH SUPPORT AVAILABLE

Documentation: Because these programs are public domain they do not have printed documentation. Many of the disk volumes do include short instructions on the disk as how to operate the programs.

Guarantee: All programs in the library are believed to be either public domain or freeware except those which are specifically listed as shareware. Since these programs are public domain, freeware, or shareware, all programs are copied AS IS. We cannot guarantee their performance.

Defective Disks: If you receive a disk which has I/O errors and you are unable to copy the disk, you may return it and we will replace it with a new version of the same disk volume.

Shareware Disks: Shareware is copyrighted software. The author grants the user the right to copy and distribute the software within certain restrictions. The author also grants the user limited use of the program (typically for a tryout period of a week to a month), after which time the user is asked to pay the author a fee (buy the program) or erase the disk. Usually when the user buys the software by sending the fee, the author sends the user the most current version of the software, often with complete documentation. You can order shareware disks from Big Red for the usual copying fee. When you receive the disk, it will have complete instructions on how to pay the shareware fee. 

Asteroids, and allows the user to design customized spaceships. In Chips and Dips the player must roam the screen collecting objects while avoiding killer robots. The player must climb ladders, and jump onto objects.

GS52- Adventure Games

This disk contains IIGS adventure games and arcade action games. The adventures include Spellbinder, Castle Metacus, Original Cave Adventure and Beyond Tesseract. The arcade games include Worm, Battleship and Beast.



GS58 - Fun and Games

This disk contains 11 IIGS games and 3 stunning graphics generation programs. The games include Tic Tac Toe, As the Link Turns, Follower, Romulan, Towers of Hanoi, Q*Bert, Frogger, Concentration and Backgammon. The graphics programs include 2 from Jason Harper: Polygonia and Fillmaze. Both are wonderful 3 dimensional representations of IIGS animation. PlasmaLab is almost indescribable; it contains 5 different modules that generate animated fractal-like graphics.




GS61 - One-Armed Battle

One Armed Battle, a shareware game by Ken Franklin, is a six-reel slot machine game based on the classic game of dice called Oh Shoot or Devil's Dice. The game contains many humorous digitized sounds, and if a stereo card is attached to the IIGS, will playback in stereo. Mage Maze, a shareware game written by Davis Hallwas, is a richly detailed IIGS maze game. Each maze has 10 levels that contain traps and doors that lead nowhere. All that's displayed on screen is a compass, and an animation that charts the players travels through the maze.

GS65 - Entertainment

Included are Wheel, a text based version of Wheel of Fortune; Yahtzee, a beautiful looking and fun to play version of the dice game classic; Fourplay, a Tetris-like strategy game; Tetrotrix, a Tetris clone with versions supplied in both English and French; Brian Greenstone's latest offering, Senseless Violence 2, a shoot 'em up with a socially responsible anti-drug message; and MatheMusic, a pendulum-like graphics display that plays heavenly music.




GS72- Card Games

Cartus Primus is one of the best shareware programs that we've seen. It allows you to play three-handed versions of the following card games: Cribbage, Gin Rummy, Pinochle, Hearts, and Pitch. The computer plays two of the hands and you can play the third. If you like, the computer will give you hints on which cards to play. There are also shareware versions of Euchre and Sheepshead on this disk.



GS79 - Plunder!

This disk contains a game from Dr. Ken Franklin. Plunder! is a game of chance and daring for 1 to 4 players of any age. In Plunder!, you and your competitors find yourself in a treasure room which is filled with various packages. You know most of the packages have treasures but one of them has a bomb. You must decide when to leave the room. If you wait too long and the bomb is uncovered, you lose.



GS88 - PixMix

PixMix allows you to load any IIGS SHR graphic and the program then creates a jigsaw puzzle from the graphic. A graphic can be broken up into as few as 6 large blocks, or as many as 80 smaller blocks. Using the Apple Desktop with pull-down menus, PixMix allows blocks to be swapped with a simple click of the mouse. Twenty-five graphics are supplied along with the program.




GS30 - Solitaire Games

If you like card games, this is a "must have" disk. It contains 5 different card games which all use SHR graphics. The games are Casino Solitaire, Slot Poker, Pyramid Solitaire, Monte Carlo and Poker Solitaire.



GS39- GS Games

This disk contains 4 action packed, freeware arcade games for the IIGS: Crackle, Quadronome, Copy Killers, and As The Link Turns. Copy Killers is a very fast action joystick controlled arcade game. The player is an FBI agent hunting for software pirates in a maze. You must shoot the pirates before being attacked by computer viruses.




GS45- Orbizone /Chips & Dips This disk contains 2 wildly amusing, arcade shareware games. Orbizone is an outer space shoot 'em up arcade game that is played with a joystick. It is based on the classic arcade hit

GS91 - Entertainment

Tonight's Sky v3.0 is the finest planetarium program for the IIGS. This program is an integrated software package designed as a simple tool for amateur astronomers to prepare for an evening's observing. The program will calculate the positions of the Sun, Moon, and planets and plot them on star maps using various formats. Also included on the disk is PowerPlay, a game that has four different modules called FourPlay, Tron, PigNBull and Gridlock. Other games include Brain Teaser, Castle Metacus, Video Jazz and Color.GS.

GS95 - Mini Prix

This is a grand prix carracing game that has you behind the wheel of a Formula 1 Lotus. A game screen is displayed that has side by side windows. One window shows your progress as you go around the track, and the other shows the view surrounding your car. All action is controlled with a joystick. Steer with the stick, accelerate with one button and brake with the other. The documentation for this game is written in French. This game must be booted from Slot 5, Drive 1.



GS103 - Cosmocade Disk A

Cosmocade is actually two games in one. On this disk, you get the Journey to Calibus game. It requires a joystick and involves lots of "shootup" action. You do not need to have Disk B (GS104) in order to play Journey to Calibus. In this game, you are in a space ship which is capable of firing missiles. As you fly over various terrains, alien ships and other objects fly towards you. You can either avoid them or shoot them. When you shoot the objects, some of them will mutate to other objects. By collecting these mutant objects, you will be rewarded with good things such as better weaponry, more ammo and free lives. At the end of each level, there is a super alien which you must defeat. Calibus also comes with two editors which will allow you to create your own worlds.




GS104 - Cosmocade Disk B

This disk contains Naxos, the second game of the Cosmocade series. You can play Naxos without having the Journey to Calibus disk, but we strongly suggest that you get both disks. In Naxos, you're in a jungle which is inhabited by aliens. As they jump up from behind bushes or come along the path, you must shoot them before they shoot you.


GS105- Space Clusters

This is a clone of Galaxian, an arcade-style game where space invaders swoop down from the top of the screen to attack your lone space craft. You use the joystick to manuever out of the way and fire missiles at them until you have decimated their ranks. The animation on this program is very fast. It must be booted from Drive 5, Slot 1.



GS110 - Milestones.2000

This disk contains a computerized version of the classic children's card game in which you race your opponent by playing mileage cards. In addition to mileage cards, you also are dealt accident cards, remedy cards, speed limits, and prevention cards. You can use accident cards and speed limits to slow your opponent's progress. Remedy cards or prevention cards are necessary to recover from cards that your opponent has played against you.



GS111- Tetris.Spinoffs

This disk contains two new shareware games which are spinoffs of the basic Tetris game. They are Columns (version 1.1) and Antetris. In Columns, multi-color columns drop from the top of the screen. You can rotate the colors and manuever the column. Whenever you get three of the same color in a straight line, they are removed from the screen and the other blocks above them drop down. The straight line can be horizontal, vertical or even diagonal.


Antetris takes a completely different approach. You start the game with a logiam of Tetris-like shapes arrayed at the top of the screen. You control a gun at the bottom of the screen and attempt to shoot the Tetris shapes as they begin to fall. There is a lot of strategy involved in choosing which shapes to shoot first, so that you cause the shapes to fall in an orderly manner. If you shoot the wrong shape, you'll cause an avalanche and your position will be overcome.

GS113-GS115 Bouncing Bluster


This three-disk set contains a game which is a clone of Arkanoid. You use the mouse to move a paddle at the bottom of the screen. The paddle will deflect a ball which will then knock out bricks in the upper portion of the screen. As you hit some of the bricks, they will release power capsules. If you catch a power capsule with your paddle, it will give you additional features such as the ability to fire missiles or additional balls. As you clear each screen of the bricks, you advance to the next level.

Bouncing Bluster requires a special version of the System disk which is included on GS113. You must boot your system with this disk. Bouncing Bluster cannot be launched from the Finder or System 5.0. After GS113 has loaded, you will then need to insert the GS114 which contains the actual game. Disk GS115 contains a level editor which will allow you to design your own layouts of bricks.



GS117- Star Trek Classic GS

As Captain Kirk, your next mission is to make the galaxy safe from the Klingons. You have 31 days to complete your mission. Use the Enterprise's navigational system, long and short range scanners, photon torpedoes and phaser banks! This shareware game is a complete rewrite of the classic text-based game that has been around for years. It's the same, fun game but with IIGS full-color graphics and music background. The program requires System 5.0.4, 1.5 megs of RAM and two 3.5" drives or a hard disk drive.




GS118- Memory Cards

This disk contains three classic card games. They are Wisconsin Rummy, Hearts and Memory Cards. All of the games use the full graphic capability of the GS. Wisconsin Rummy is a typical gin rummy game in which you try to group your hand into groups of 3 or 4 cards that are similarly suited or are consecutive. Hearts is based on the card game by the same name. You take tricks but try to avoid taking any hearts or the Queen of Spades. Memory Cards is a version of Concentration. It is filled with amusing

graphics and sound effects. As the game starts, a series of cards are shown, all face down. You try to find the pairs of cards which match. The player with the most matches is the winner.



GS119- Columns Version 2.0

This is a Tetris-like game in which you manipulate falling blocks of different patterns in sequences of 3 or more blocks arranged horizontally, vertically or diagonally. When you succeed, the matched blocks disappear. The program features a rock and roll sound track, digitized sounds and great graphics. If you like Tetris, then you'll love this game.


GS129- Games, Games, Games This disk is chock full of games. There are several shareware games by Jim Sepanik including Cribbage, Rubik Cube and Poker Challenge. Bill Tudor has added two great games on this disk. Solitaire is a New Desk Accessory that allows you to play the classic game of Klondike solitaire. Backgammon is another Desk Accessory game. For those who like fast action arcade games, try Golden Bug by Jason Smart. Use your joystick to navigate through a series of mazes which are similar to Pac Man. There are also two programs on this disk that generate word search puzzles.



GS131- State-of-the-Art Games

Xpurpose by Bob Owens is based on Chinese Checkers but it has great graphics and sound effects. PlasmaLab2 by Peter Brinkley has 5 separate modules including Life, PlasmaLab, Wolf, Demon and WireWorld. Blackjack Tutor by Dave Tribby will not only let you play this popular gambling card game but it will also give you valuable tips on how to improve you chances of winning. From Beyond is the FTA's version of Tetris. You'll need to quickly line up the falling blocks into matching rows, columns or diagonals. If you're not quick enough, the blocks will fill the screen and you'll lose. FTA Plotting is a fast action arcade game that's like a cross between Tetris and Space Invaders. Rather than lining up blocks into neat rows and columns, you'll be blasting them instead. A joystick is required.

Jason Smart, has written the graphic oriented adventure game called ExplorerGS. There are three adventure scenarios included. In these games, you'll be battling monsters and searching for hidden treasure. As you move about the game board, all progress will be charted by the auto-mapping feature. But what's even more fun than playing an adventure game? Why, it's creating our own game from scratch. You can use Game Maker to easily and quickly create monster filled nightmare scenarios. No programming skills are needed to create sophisticated adventure games.



GS137- Strategy Arcade

DrMario, modeled after the coin-operated arcade game, is yet another Tetris-like game. You'll need to line up the multi-colored falling capsules in a test of speed and strategy. What sets Dr Mario apart are the obstacles and viruses found on the play screen. Since you're the doctor, you can remove the obstacle.

Quintette comes from France and is two games in one. Game play is enhanced by the beautiful looking play screen. PuzzleGS is modeled after the 4 x 4 plastic number puzzles. You move the letters around so that they appear in sequence. Pac Man is a desk accessory. Use the "A,Z,J, and K" keys to navigate through the maze .



This is a karate arcade game. The object is to earn a black belt by winning a series of contests against increasingly tough competition. You can use the joystick or the keyboard to jump, kick or chop at your opponent. Some of the moves that you can use are nagashi, yokogeri-keage, tobi and kansetsu-geri. This game must be booted from Slot 5.

GS143- Quest for the Hoard


The object of this game is to locate treasures which are hidden within a 26 x 17 grid. You do this by using the mouse to click on the various squares in the grid. If you click on a square which is near a treasure, it will display an aura. This tells you that a treasure is near. Before you may actually uncover the treasure, you must select a "Spell of Protection". Uncovering a treasure without being protected ends the game.

GS146- Easy Dead

In this game, you're chased around the screen by an ever increasing number of objects. At first, it is fairly easy to avoid being caught but soon it's almost impossible to keep from dying. I guess that's why it is called Easy Dead. Once you've been caught, you simply start the game over again. There's not much strategy involved but it's a challenge to see how many objects you can get on the screen at one time.

GS147- The Fly Demo

This game features lots of fancy scrolling and a rock music background, but the game itself is rather crude. Your mouse cursor is changed into a house fly and you have to move the fly around on the screen and avoid being caught by two rapidly moving lines. It is somewhat similar to Qix.




GS153- FTA Bouncing 'Ferno It's a Marble Madness type game, but with incredible graphics, sound effects and music. There's even an editor for you to create your own levels. The program is hard drive installable. There are three levels, each with 25 different play fields, and you can play the game with either a mouse or a joystick. On each level, you'll try to roll over and pick up a small object before going on to the next level. You may be trying until 4 a.m., as some of the objects are suspended high above the ground and you'll need to jump up to get them. Others are hidden or at the top of steep ramps.

GS157- Fun, Fun, Fun

There are 19 fun-filled GS/OS programs on this one disk. The centerpiece is Karl Bunker's game called FloorTiles. It's a strategy board game where you'll try to line up 1 to 4 randomly colored rotating tiles on a gridded play board. Just surround any tile with 3 matching colored tiles and score big points. It sounds easy but it's very addicting! Most of the other programs on this disk are graphic and sound animations or demos. There's Dufus Demo, Bottles of Beer, Stars, Power and Overcycle.

GS160- GS/OS Games

Do you like fast action, outer space, shoot 'em up arcade games? Then you'll love Lane Roath's Space Whiskey. Sure, it has an outrageous premise: all your crew got drunk while under enemy attack and you're alone to fight aliens and retrieve your valuable cargo of space whiskey. Included are lots of digitized sound effects and 3-D star fields that you'll be navigating through via mouse or joystick control.

From France comes PepeGS's wonderful SHR game called Computix. As you try to outsmart your IIGS, you'll be doing lots of quick mathematical calculations. Ian Schmidt has created MegaMac Munch. Like a cross between Break Out and Arkanoid, you'll be taking aim at Mac computers and trying to destroy them. You can't lose, making it a great exercise for preschoolers.

GS164- Galactic Conquest

Compete to become Supreme Emperor of the Galaxy. You begin on your lowly home planet with 20 cash credits. You must amass a fleet of ships. You then use your ships to trade, fight, capture other ships and conquer planets. You can fight amongst the other players or the four computer opponent scout ships from surrounding galaxies. The goal is to see who can build and maintain the greatest galactic empire.

This disk also contains a demo version of Crystal Quest. You can play the first five levels. We also included an older IIGS program called Bounce-It!. It is a shareware version of Brick Out.




GS169- Blue Helmet

A 3-D road race game from the F.T.A. It's never been completely finished and it does hang the computer whenever you complete three laps. Butit may be fastest road race game ever written for the IIGS. You use a joystick to control your race car (the driver has a blue helmet) through rocks and road signs, along winding narrow roads.


GS172 - Strategy Games

This disk contains five games of strategy. Space Arrow is a graphics battle game for one or two players. It includes 15 strategy files for either or both players or design your own. Shove-It has the player push apples on the layout to the empty apple spots in the least number of moves. It features 50 built-in layouts or you can create your own. Golf is a solitaire card game in which you begin play with seven piles of five cards each. The goal is to play all the cards unto the base stack. MoonStriker has you piloting a remote controlled space craft on the moon. The object is to intercept the aliens as they land. Watch out for the moon's surface or you will crash. BlockBuster is an educational children's game for ages 4 to 7.



GS174 - Bouncin'Ferno II

This is a much improved remake of the original Bouncin' Ferno game by the FTA. This new version was written by Dustin Mitchell. It is a game which is very similar to Marble Madness. The goal of the game is to bounce a marble through 3 levels. Each level has 25 different rooms. You need only manuever the marble to the exit and you can advance to the next room. Most rooms have additional objects which you can hit to score additional points. Although this is an arcade type game, it requires a lot of thinking as you attempt to figure out how to work your way to an exit. Bouncin'Ferno II is GS/OS compatible and is hard drive installable. The levels on this disk are also new. They were created by Brent Dunst.




GS175 - Boggled GS

This disk contains a new shareware word game from Kendrick Mock called Boggled GS. The object is to find, within 3 minutes, as many words as possible in a 4 by 4 grid of randomly generated letters. Words may be formed in any sequence of 3 or more adjacent letters, joined horizontally, vertically, or diagonally. You can play against another human or against the computer. Since the computer has a built-in dictionary of 16,000 words, it is almost impossible to beat the computer. This program is hard drive installable. It requires System 5.0.4 or System 6.0. It takes two or three minutes for the computer to create the board and search for words so you have to be a little patient.

Also on this disk is Ant Wars by Karl Bunker. In this game you play the red ants which are pitted against the black ants. You capture black ants by using the mouse to position a red ant on two sides of a black ant. This is easy in the first two levels, but just wait until you get to the third level!

GS176 - Pente GS

This is another shareware game by Kendrick Mock. Pente is a board game somewhat similar to Go or Go-Moku. The object is to place pieces on the (19 x 19) board so that you can get five of them in a row, either horizontally, vertically or diagonally. Of course, your opponent (either the computer or another human) is trying to block your pieces. It is also possible to capture your opponents pieces by trapping two of his pieces between your pieces. This is a simple game which is very easy to learn yet it's quite fun. The program requires System 5.0.4 or System 6.0. If you have a hard drive with lots of Desk Accessories installed, you may have to do a "Shift-Boot" before running the game because it requires a great deal of stack space.



GS177 & GS178 - Viad

Viad is an acronym for "Vocabulary In Any Direction." What happens if you cross together the games Columns, Tetris and Scrabble. The answer is Viad! This shareware program by Kendrick Mock is similar to WordTris. It fills two 3.5" disks but can be run by users with a single 3.5" drive. It requires at least 1.25 Megabytes of RAM and System 5.0.4 or System 6.0. It is fully GS/OS compatible and can be installed on a hard drive.


As in Columns or Tetris, blocks will fall from the top of the screen. If left to themselves the blocks will eventually stack up and fill the game screen. When a stack of blocks reaches the top of the screen, the game ends. In Viad, a single block falls at a time. This block will have some letter from A to Z printed on it. If you can arrange the blocks so that an English word at least three letters long is formed, either horizontally, vertically, or diagonally, then those letters will disappear. The object of Viad is to form as many words as possible before the game ends. This is challenging to say the least.

GS179 - DuelTris Demo

This disk contains the demo version of DuelTris from DreamWorld (but is has almost all the


features found in the commercial version). DuelTris is another variation of Tetris. But now, you don't have to enter solitary confinement to experience a Tetris high! That's right - in DuelTris, two players can square off in - what else? - a Tetris Duel! This is not, as one might guess, simply two players playing separate games, racking up points against the clock. Instead, DuelTris features the DuelLink - in which, if you eliminate two or more of your own rows at once, those rows disappear from your playing area, and move over to the bottom of your opponent's playing area - there to bedevil and generally irritate him or her. DuelTris has many other features, however. If you are not socially inclined, you can play DuelTris against the computer, which is almost as much fun. Plus, in single-player mode, DuelTris offers probably the best game of Tetris around on the GS. There are several "special" blocks that can liven up the game - Tetris purists can switch these off. For example, there are blocks that act like a falling anvil and wipe out any blocks underneath them.

Also included on this disk is DreamVoir which is a combination slideshow and SoundSmith music player.



GS180 - Spy Hunter


This is a freeware game by Shane Richards of Australia. It is a joystick controlled racecar game. You try to avoid being run off the road by dropping oil slicks, firing lasers, missiles and smart bombs. There are fifteen types of enemy cars chasing you. They will attempt to crash into your car or they will shoot at you with flame throwers. This is race car combat at its finest.



GS181 - LetterSlide

Another game strategy word game by Kendrick Mock. In this game, scattered throughout the playing area are blocks that contain letters. These blocks are often surrounded by jewels. To complete a level (of which there are 99), you must push the letter blocks around until they spell words of from three to nine letters. Whenever you spell a word, those blocks disappear. You'll need all of your word skills to be successful in this game.




GS182 - Bowl GS & Others

Bowl GS is a bowling-alley simulation. Use your mouse to position bowler and then double-click to release the ball. Depending on how you time your clicks, you either roll straight down the alley or you'll hook the ball. The program keeps score and up to three bowlers can compete at once. Also on this disk are several NDA games that include MultiTris, Wizardry Doctor, Fun House, Game Hacker, Invert, L.E.D. Message, Minehunt, Mouse Mileage, Power Grid, Shredder and Sound File Fixer.


GS188 - Space Games

Solarian GS is a shareware game where you control a space ship that moves back and forth at the bottom of the screen. Your job is to shoot the aliens that attack you from above and gather bonus points. Invaders from Space is the shareware version of Space Invaders. Object is to shoot the aliens before they destroy your ship.



GS195 - Star Trek: 1st Contact


Star Trek: First Contact (version 2.1) is a shareware game written in ZBasic. The object is to explore the universe and to determine the mission of an intruder ship in your vicinity. You control all aspects of the starship command while on the random missions. Game will work on an Apple IIe, IIc or IIGS. Double Solitaire is a shareware game of the Klondike version of solitaire with a twist. Use the same eight foundations and compete against the computer to see who can get the most cards played. Beyond Columns CDA is a new version of the Columns game where you match blocks in rows and columns as they fall from the top of the screen. ShowMe!/NDA/Fx (version 1.0.4) is a graphics display and conversion program for all types of IIGS graphics plus MacPaint and GIF files. Cleaner Clean Up helps to prevent you from messing up the icons in the Finder's desktop. ShadowWrite (v1.3.3) NDA is a full-featured word processor. New features include support for WestCode's Typeset program and the importing of Softdisk Issue Text documents.



3.5" DISKS

GS197 - Plumb Crazy

This disk includes Plumb Crazy where you will have to build a conduit connecting the left side to the right side. But the water has already started dripping, and you need to connect new pipes before the water runs out the end. The problem though is that the pipe you get may not be the fitting you need. There are 20 different levels. Collocation is a fun game where you duplicate the pattern presented to you by pushing the blocks in place. As you build your pattern there are bad guys bounding about the screen to dissolve what you have built. ExplorerGS is a graphic oriented, adventure game. It first appeared on our disk Volume GS131. Now we've added two new adventures, Daventry and Batroom. In these games you will be battling monsters, bats and worthy opponents in your search for hidden treasures and wealth. We also included the program Game Maker to allow you to create your own Explorer game from scratch. It's an adventure game construction set where you'll be able to easily create your own scenarios.


Tinies, a strategy game from Brutal Deluxe in France, has all of the features that you'd expect in a commercial product: fantastic graphics, sound effects and it's really fun to play. Plus my hat's off to Brutal Deluxe for doing such a great conversion. The game has 3200 color graphics, it is compatible with System 5.0.4 or higher, it is hard drive installable. In the game, there are 4 colorful monsters called Tinies. It is your job to help them get to their sleeper, or home base, which is the same color as the Tiny. There are 101 different levels and each level has it's own challenges and problems to solve. You can only move one Tiny at a time. Once you start moving a Tiny, he will continue to move in the same direction until he bumps into a wall or an obstacle. There is a time limit and it seems like there is never quite enough time to solve all the problems unless you're completely mistake free. In the different levels, you'll find such obstacles as Arrows that force the Tinies to go in a specific direction, Punches that hit any Tinies that get too close, Teleporters that transport Tinies

according to their colors, Switches that need to be activated, Doors that can only be opened by a Tiny of the same color, and Bombs that explode when a Tiny walks on them.

GS202 - Treasures


Treasures from Heaven is a new shareware game. It is a sequel to the Quest of the Hoard series and based on Atari's Klax. In the game play a wave of random objects are unleashed from the right side of the screen, much like the Tetris style of games. The object of the game is to pile the same type objects in sets of three. To do that you control a shield that can catch the objects as they come across the screen. Once the objects are on the shield you can place them strategically so you get three in a row either vertically or horizontally. When a three in a row is made, those objects disappear. The process continues until there are more than four in a row. This ends the game.



GS209 - Cogito

Cogito reminds me of a two-dimensional version of Rubik's cube. A grid of various colored marbles and tiles is scrambled. It's your job to restore the grid to its original formation. To do this you can move a row left or right, or move a column up or down. Of course, whenever you move a row, it tends to mess up your columns and vice versa. Consequently you have to carefully consider the effects of your moves.

There are 120 different grids or levels for you to solve in Cogito. You can start play on any level so if you find one level too difficult, you skip on to the next one. Cogito is System 6.0 friendly and hard drive installable. It features a musical soundtrack and several different background screens.



GS210 - Stalactites

Stalactites is a new shareware game by Bill Heineman. It is surprisingly addictive. You use the keyboard to control a small ship around on the playing area. Stalactites start coming down from the top of the screen and two balls bound around on the screen. If you run into either a stalactite or a ball, it destroys your ship. However moving your ship under a stalactite pushes the stalactite back up giving you more room. Hence the object of the game is to avoid the balls while keeping the stalactites at bay. Along the way, you'll get a shield which destroys the balls but the stalactites start growing faster and more and more balls appear.

Also on this disk is the latest version of ShowMe, a desk accessory which is great for viewing and converting graphics. This version does a great job with GIF graphics.

Cheats & Installs

GS142 - Cheats & Deprotects

A "cheat" is a small program that you install on a computer game and it gives you additional powers which help you to win the game. A "deprotect" is a short program which allows you to remove or disable the copy-protection from a program. An "install" is anything which allows you to install a program on your hard drive. A "walk thru" is a text file which gives you hints for solving an adventure game. This disk contains an install and cheat for The Immortal. It also has aids for Task Force, Qix, Beyond Zork, Gnarly Golf, Keef the Thief, Chessmaster 2100 and many others.

GS152 - Cheats & Deprotects

This disk includes aids for Jack Nicklaus Golf, Fastbreak, Test Drive II: The Duel, Dungeon Master, Transylvania III and many of the Sierra adventure games.

GS192 - Cheats & Deprotects

This disk contains a collection of information and patches which are designed to make some of the commercial games for the IIGS more enjoyable and easy to use. There are cheats which give you increased powers or capabilities in games. There are deprotects which allow you to remove the copy-protection schemes. And there are installs which make it possible to put the game on your hard disk. Most of the items in this collection don't take up much space on disk, so there's a lot on this disk. The featured item is a walk-thru for "Out of This World." It describes how to pass each level and gives all the passwords. Some of the other programs covered on this disk include ChessMaster 2100, Black Cauldron, Keef the Thief, and Neuromancer.

DEMO DISKS

We've had lots of requests for the following disks and so against our better judgement we have added them to the library. Don't purchase them unless you're sure it's what you want. To be included in this group, a disk meets at least one of the following criteria:

- 1. The program is not interactive.
- 2. The program is a demo.
- 3. It has bad language and violence.
- 4. It doesn't work on ROM 3.0.
- 5. It must be booted from Slot 5.

TECH SUPPORT AVAILABLE

GS34 - Nucleus

The first, and perhaps the best, of FTA's many dazzling graphic animations. In Nucleus, a graphic object that looks like a strand of DNA appears within a window on the screen. The object twists around making a 3-D presentation. You have some control over how the object behaves. And all the while, rock music is playing in the background. This program doesn't work on ROM 3.0 and it must be cold-booted from slot 5.

GS183 - Star Wizard

A joystick game in which a paper airplane flys thru a maze. It doesn't work on ROM 3.0 and must be cold-booted.

GS184 - Last Rites '93

This doesn't work on ROM 3.0. It contains an unfinished shareware game and a version of Dr. Mario which does work but sometimes crashes.

GS185 - Sword of Sodan

A demo of an unfinished GS game. It looks neat but is non-interactive.

GS194 - Bulla Plus

This disk contains an odd-ball collection of halffinished games and graphic demonstrations that were written by a group of French programmers. Bulla is a game which has some similarity to the Mario Brothers adventures. Bulla is not finished so you can only move your player through the first level. A joystick is required. Other programs include a spinning Coke can, an oscillator-like animation with background music, and a demonstration of vertical text scrolling.

GS203 - Financial Genius

This disk contains the "crippleware" version of a new financial record keeping program. You will be able to try out all the features but the "save" option has been disabled.

GS207 - Opale Demo

Opale is a demo of a graphic adventure game that has been started but not completed. It is released by Brutal Deluxe. The demo's excellent graphics include various city scenes with animation. The graphics are accompanied by a thrilling sound track. There is no game play or interaction so you just set back and watch.

GS212 - Bille Art

This doesn't work on ROM 3.0 but it does have a complete game. It was written by Brutal Deluxe. In the game, you play billiards and attempt to bank the cue ball off of selected spots. This game also contains some X-rated graphics. This game must be cold-booted from slot 5. When the message "Unable to Load ProDOS" appears, press the Clear key on the numeric keypad and the program will finish loading.

GS53 - Sound Smith

This disk includes the Sound Smith Program files and 1 sample music file. Sound Smith is a 14 Track sequencer that can be used to create music on an Apple IIGS. The sound quality is superior to any other music program on the market. Sound Smith uses standard ASIF instruments. When instruments are loaded, a piano keyboard is shown, and one can play that instrument by clicking on the piano.

GS54 - Sound Smith Music

This disk contains 6 music files for use with Sound Smith. The names of the selections are: Guetto4, Crystal Hammer, Aldabaran, Footloose, File 52. One of the tunes is a file that demonstrates how to use Sound Smith songs with The Music Studio.

GS55 - Sound Smith Music

This disk contains 6 music files for use with Sound Smith. The names of the selections are: Amegas, Behind, Blizzard, Cambodia, Duggar, End Theme, Garcon, Moments in Love, and S114.

GS56 - Sound Smith Music

This disk contains 7 music files for use with Sound Smith. The names are: Axel F, Big in Japan, Forever, Jungle 2, File23, File35, and File42.



There's classical selections, including Ravel's Bolero and Pachibel's Canon In D. Plus it picks up where Sound Smith left off, and in addition to offering rich and full sounding music with its 14 track full-stereo sequencer, it lets you create musical compositions you never thought possible before. The FTA has broken Sound Smith's 64K size limitation for instruments. Noisetracker also has the capability of letting digitized sound effects be added to songs.

NoiseTracker is also capable of loading in and playing MOD song files created for the Amiga computer. The FTA has added the Second Sight Sound Editor. This editor will allow you to edit any Apple IIGS, Macintosh or Amiga digitized sound file.

TECH SUPPORT AVAILABLE

GS109 - AudioZap

AudioZap is a full-featured sound recording, playback, and editing system for the Apple IIGS computer. A stereo card is recommended for playback, although AudioZap works just fine in mono. For recording, a Sonic Blaster, Audio Animator, or HyperStudio microphone card is required. The program has the capability to load sounds in the following formats: raw data, 8:4 ACE compressed and HyperStudio. It can save the sounds as raw data, 8:4 ACE compressed files, HyperStudio sound files, or as Apple Standard Instrument Format (ASIF) files. ASIF files can be used as instruments for Sound Smith. AudioZap requires Apple IIGS System 5.0 or higher.

GS144 - Music Const. Songs

This disk contains many songs for use with Electronic Arts Music Construction Set program. There are over 40 Christmas carols, 20 classical compositions, 25 theme songs and 45 rock & roll tunes.

GS162 - rSound Disk

Included with System 6.0 is the all new Sound Control Panel which gives IIGS users the ability to attach digitized sounds to all standard desktop events and activities. This disk contains a large collection of over 50 different sound effects in the rSound format. They include beeps, animal sounds, outer space sounds, bells and many others.



GS187 - Sound Programs

This disk contains several sound and music programs. Soundsmith Version 1.01 is the latest version of the classic music player and composition program for the IIGS. It is a shareware program by Huibert Aalbers. SoniqTracker by Tim Meekins is a freeware program which will import Amiga-style "mod" songs and play them in juke box fashion. ModZap by Ian Schmidt is another jukebox player for Amiga mod songs. It is a freeware program. rSounder by Paul Benson is a utility to convert binary sound files into the rSound format used in System 6.0. Mac Sound Grabber is a neat little utility by Steve Stephenson. It allows you to grab sounds from a Mac file, sample them, convert them, and save them in IIGS format.



This program can be used to draw graphs of functions of the type f(x). You can use sine, cosine, tangent, etc. The computed graphs are SHR pictures which can be imported into DTP programs like AppleWorks GS. Some of the documentation is in German.

GS130 - Animations

This disk contains a number of Finder launchable animation and sound programs. They include Kendrick Mock's Bush Movie. Andy McFadden adds his Arc3D and Not Modulae in which 3-D objects float in space. The demo shows a cube, the spaceship from Modulae and several other objects. Tim Meekins GS Experience combines a highly intricate spinning Z along with animated text that changes before your eyes.



GS134 - Animaga

This disk contains 8 different animated sequences that combine stunning graphics with rock music sound tracks created with Sound Smith. If you liked Nucleus, then you'll want to get this disk.

GS135 - S.A.P.


If you've ever wanted to create your own animated sequences on the IIGS, here's the program to get you started. Kendrick Mock's SAP (Simple Animation Program) allows you to create stunning animations and add your own Sound Smith musical soundtrack or digitized sound effects. No programming knowledge is necessary but a paint program would come in handy. Three modules are included. Use the Projector module to run the actual animations. Use the Actoredit to create action and use the Scenedit to piece together the actions with the backgrounds and the sound track. A step-bystep tutorial is included.

GS136 - The SAP Wall

Inspired by Pink Floyd's "The Wall" rock album, this disk uses the SAP program to combine powerful music, graphics reminiscent of the movie and digitized sounds. It will give you a good idea of just how powerful the SAP animation system is.

GS138 - Delta Demo

The last "demo" program that was ever officially released by the FTA. You'll love the 3-D objects and the fast-paced sound track. We challenge anyone to come up with a better example of just how good the IIGS is when it comes to graphics and sound. A must have for every IIGS lover.




GS140 - Paper Doll Designer

This disk contains clip art and ideas for creating customized paper doll sheets, books and stationary. You use a program like PaintWorks Gold to put together different modules like the doll's head, hair and bodies. Then print them out and have fun.

GS141 - Runes: The Collection

This disk contains System fonts, Finder Icons and Print Shop IIGS graphics, fonts and borders. All of the items are based on the ancient Nordic lettering system called Runes.



GS189 - Virtual Art Gallery

Virtual Art Gallery by Jason Harper is a unique graphics display program. You select a group of any standard graphic files. The program will convert them to grayscale and then display them as though they were in a virtual art gallery. You can then move through the 3-D gallery and view the art. GS Entertainment by Clayburn W. Juniel, III is a graphic slide show and music program. It can show PNT, PIC, ANI and 3200color graphics. It can show them individually or in a timed display. Plus you can play music in several different file formats.

GS199 - Eyes, Ears & Roses

Chris McKinsey has released two Finder extensions that are shareware. They are called Eye and Ear. Once you have it installed on your System Disk (requires System 6.0 or higher), a Finder extension appears under the Special menu in the Finder. Eye lets you view almost any type of IIGS graphic file by simply doubleclicking on it. It works with SHR graphics, 3200-Color graphics, GIFs and several other types. Ear has the same function except that it works with sounds and music. Once you have installed

GS21 - CheapPaint

CheapPaint is a full-featured paint program for the IIGS. It allows you to create and modify artwork in the 320 mode. It has the usual features of most paint programs including copy and paste, lasso, fat bits, color cycling, brushes, stencils and add text.

GS22 - UtilityWorks


UtilityWorks GS has the ability to load, save, and print any type of SHR graphic, display any GS font, display icons, read an ASCII text file or an AppleWorks word processor file.

GS32 - FontAsm

This is the best shareware GS-font editor. It includes many features which are missing in other font editors including the ability to double a font's size.

GS40 - Fractals & Animation

This disk includes 11 IIGS programs that create animated computer graphics that are dazzling, stunning and thought provoking. Included are: Bounce, a program that displays an animated Apple logo; Fractal.GS, a program that creates beautiful fractal geometric images; Moire, a program that displays constantly moving animated graphics; Mosaic, a program that generates kaleidoscopic special effects; Setview, a program that generates fractal images and their Mandlebrot subsets; and SHKalid, a program that generates kaleidoscopic animation.



GS107 - YAFP

This is my favorite fractal generating program for the IIGS. It allows you to create Manelbrot, Julia, Dragon or Biomorph fractal graphics. It is very easy to use and contains many useful help screens. The fractals can take a long time to generate (leave your computer on overnight for



GS200 - FLI Viewer



If you've never watched an FLI animation before, I think you'll enjoy this disk.


GS50 - Color Clip Art

This disk contains hundreds of clip art images for use with 640-mode IIGS programs, such as AppleWorks GS and HyperStudio. Most of the graphics have been converted from Print Shop format. All graphics are supplied as Apple Preferred Format 640 mode \$C0 filetype compressed graphics. All of them have gone through a lengthy conversion procedure that maintains all of the original colors, so no palette manipulation will be necessary.

El Macro is a CDA that is designed to create and execute macros from any ProDOS.8 or GS/OS program.

GS139 - Solar Eclipse Tutorial

This disk presents a slide show tutorial about solar eclipses. Some of the screens contain historical information, others talk about the myths that surround eclipses, plus there are maps showing the patch of an eclipse. The presentation is enlivened by photographs and computer modeled eclipses.

EclipseGS by Larry Bell will alert you when the next solar or lunar eclipse will be visible in your area. It will even display the next eclipse on the screen. Also included on this disk are a series of NASA newsletters and text files which detail the Ulysses, Galileo, Voyager and Viking missions.

GS158 - System 6.0 Special FX

This disk includes several patches to fix some minor problems with System 6.0's Find File NDA, the Sound Control Panel, and ProDOS.8 with a RamFast SCSI card. There's also a lot of software here that will let you take advantage of the new features of System 6.0. QuickLaunch and Quit-To v 2.0 make it easy to switch from one application to the next without using the Finder. Automenus 2.0 lets pull down menus pull themselves down. Custom GS/0S let's you change the message displayed while your GS is loading and we've even included five new sound files in the rSound format for the Control Panel.

GS161 - Make the Switch

This disk contains a number of tools that help you convert certain types of data from Mac and IBM computers into a format usable on the IIGS. This companion disk contains the tools necessary to convert some graphics, icons and digitized sounds as well as providing the means to download, via modem, some Mac and IBM files and make them usable on the IIGS. Included are A2.FX, Agate, Audio Zap, FAX, GIF strippers, HFS.Link, Icon Applicator, IconEd, Resource Spy, ShowPic, Shrinkit and STS, as well as several long articles describing how to use all these valuable utilities.

We took every Desk Accessory that we could find and tested them for System 6.0 compatibility. Then we filled this disk with those that worked. ShowPic will display and convert SHR graphics. CDA, File Manager, FileTools, FinderReader, Font.DA Installer 2.0, Havok 2, MenuTime, Odometer, PacMan Nda, SHR saver, Spooler, SuperDataPath and Tearbar.

GS168 - Formula Club

This disk is a terrific interactive game for chemistry students to use in practicing chemical symbols and formulas. The game works by randomly generating chemical formulas from the ion list saved in the program. The name of the formula is displayed in large font and the student types in the correct chemical formula.

GS170 - Inits Galore

This disk contains many new system extensions (NDAs, Initialization Files, Control Panels, and Sounds) that can add many new functions to the Finder in System 6.0. DOS 3.3 Solution provides a method to copy and run some DOS 3.3 programs from the Finder (including installing them on a hard drive). TeachRead allows you to read Teach and text files from the Finder. MenuMaster allows you to customize your desktop menus with different colors and fonts. SuperDataPath allows you fast and convenient access to often used directories and their files.

GS186 - Utility Programs

This disk contains a number of new and exciting programs which add new features to your IIGS applications. Keyboard Extender is a freeware PIF which adds functionality for owners of an extended keyboard. BRAM Checker checks the contents of the Control Panel settings which are stored in the Battery RAM. It will notify you if any changes have occurred since the last time you booted your system. Scrapbook NDA is a clone of the Mac Scrapbook. It allows you to copy your favorite graphics into the scrapbook and then they will be easily available to be pasted into an application. GUIMaster lets you customize the colors for windows and alerts on the desktop. ProBoot is a utility which makes it easy to boot up your 3.5" drive if you have a hard drive. SANE Fix fixes up a bug in the SANE toolbox. It will help prevent crashes in AppleWorks GS. ShadowWrite is a freeware DA word processer. It features rulers and text justification. Plus you can use it to print or view Teach, Text or SRC documents.

GS190 - Instant Access

Instant Access is a shareware program launcher that is meant to replace the Finder as the program you use to do all your launching and file maintenance. It should be able to do everything the Finder can and more, but it only uses a fraction of the disk space that the Finder uses and it loads a lot faster.

This program can launch S16, SYS and BAS files. It can install CDA and NDA files. It can

view TXT, AppleWorks and Teach files. It can display most types of graphic files including compressed, GIF, and 3200-color. It can play most digitized sound files, SoundSmith and Amiga Mod songs. Plus you can do the standard file management procedures such as copy, delete, rename and format.

IconEd 2.0 is the latest version of an Icon editor. It is a shareware program you can use to change the appearance of icons, the names of their files, and tell the Finder where to find the application that created a particular document.

GS191 - MultiGS & Patches

MultiGS is a "poor man's" version of The Manager. It allows you to launch up to seven applications simultaneously and then switch back and forth among them. I haven't done much testing but it looks really neat. This disk contains two very useful patches. The first fixes the bug in the System 6.0.1 "Choose Font" menu. The second patch lets The Manager and Signature live in peace with each other.

GS196 - Utilities & More

This disk is loaded with a collection of utilities and other programs to try out on your GS. Key Notifier is a Control Panel Device (CDEV) that provides several features related to keyboards. Tsukue is a permanent initialization file that monitors the launches of applications. It will launch them smoothly without reverting to the text screen while loading. IIGS Memory Wizard is an NDA that displays the status of your system's memory. IIGS Clock Works is an NDA that displays the system time and date in the menu bar. Drag Window eliminates the dotted lines that the window manager draws when you drag a window around. JumboDesk is an NDA that expands your desktop to manage large numbers of windows. PCT Savior is a Ram disk utility for PC Transporter users. Capture is a Print Manager port driver for debugging printer drivers. RUNQ is a program launcher utility that allows you to instantly switch from one application to another without re-entering the finder. StampOut is a TIF, which you install on your boot disk. It will increase the speed at which writes to ProDOS formatted disks occur. EMACS is a full screen text editor for creating and changing documents, programs and other text files. KeyChanger allows you to change the EasyMount key equivalent to whatever you want. LPLaser is a printer driver that offers greatly reduced printing times for the LaserJet printers.


GS208 - Foundation

You can use Foundation to create or modify the resource fork of any IIGS application. Although primarily a tool for programmers, end users can use Foundation to customize applications to their liking. For example, it can be used to alter the key-equivalents that are used in a menu.



There are productivity stacks, including one that prints a calendar for any month, a To Do reminder stack, a stack to keep track of your CD collection, stacks to keep track of checking and savings. Chere's even a computerized version of the Briggs-Meyers Personality Type test used by psychologists.




HC02 - HyperTalk Scripters

HyperCard GS includes a built-in powerful programming language, HyperTalk, that allows users, through the use of scripts, to create powerful interactive stacks. This disk will help you as you start to learn about HyperTalk, and will provide you with many routines and tools that you can easily copy into your own stacks. None of these stacks are locked, so you can study the scripts, read about what they accomplish, modify them for your own needs, or just copy them into your stacks. Included on this disk are

HC03 - MidiSynth Jukebox

This disk features a stack which can play any MidiSynth song. It has fifteen popular songs included such as Africa, Axel F, Baby Elephant and Blue Moon.




HC04 - HyperFun

This disk features a HyperCard version of an Eamon adventure complete with SHR graphics. The program is mouse driven and gives you a good idea of just how powerful HyperCard really is. Copy the stack to your hard drive before running it. There's also a couple of other small stacks for your amusement.



HC05 - HyperHome

This disk features a stack which can be used as an introduction to HyperCard and it details how to use may of HyperCard's tools. ScanForGold is a stack tutorial on how to get the best results from your hand-held scanner. For the chemistry major, there's a stack of the Periodic Table and HyperChecking will help you to balance your checkbook. Plus there's HyperSavings and a Recipe stack.



HC06 - HyperCard Composer

This is a large-sized stack that will be welcomed by stack designers who play the piano or other keyboard instruments. When the stack is run, the user is presented with a full 88 key piano keyboard. You can play songs by clicking the mouse on the correct keys. As you play, the notes will be recorded into a HyperTalk script that can easily be copied into any other stack. There are nearly 30 different instruments included so your composition can sound like a saxophone or a digital piano.

HyperStudio Stacks

Disks HS08 through HS63 require either the HyperStudio GS program or the HyperStudio run-time module. HyperStudio GS is available from Roger Wagner Publishing.

HS08 - HyperSpace

HyperShuttle, by Jim Hirsch, is an exciting and educational stack that describes in great detail the 1989 flight of the Space Shuttle Atlantis, on its mission to deploy the interplanetary probe, Galileo, on its 6 year voyage to Jupiter. The stack contains a digitized sound of the launch of the Space Shuttle, and contains lots of nicely done graphic screens, as well as very detailed textual material that describes all aspects of the Galileo flight. HyperSpace, by Charles Baca, is a tour of our solar system that uses digitized sounds and graphics. One embarks on the grand tour by clicking on graphic representations of the planets.

HS09 - Presidential Stack

ThisPresidential Stack was created by Joel Helton. Graphics of all the presidents (scanned from either oil paintings or photographs) are presented, and the user can click on any president, and learn a slew of little known facts about each.


HS10 & HS11 - Williamsburg

With this two-disk stack, you can visit colonial Williams-burg without leaving the comfort of your own home. By using this stack, you will learn about the historical background of Williamsburg and then you will take a tour of the restored village. Be sure to visit the Bruton Parish Church, the old windmill, and the Guardhouse.

HS17 - Messerschmitt Stack


This is a shareware stack which details the history and markings of the Messerschmitt 109,

a World War II German fighter plane. It contains colorful drawings of the airplanes showing their various markings. The stack covers heraldry, markings and the G-6 aircraft.



HS18 & HS19 - Capitol Stack

This two-disk stack by Duane Gossett is a simulated tour of Washington D.C., with a few twists and turns along the way, just for fun. There are several sound effects, and some neat animations. You'll visit the White House, the Capitol and even the Pentagon. This is a program that students, educators, or anyone interested in history should enjoy.



HS20 & HS21 - Dinosaurs

This two-disk stack by Larry W. Linson is all about dinosaurs. The dinosaurs are divided into three major groupings: meat eaters, big dinos and plant eaters. Within each grouping, there are several sub-groupings. For each sub-group, the user is shown a chart of the relative size of each dinosaur, a map of where the dinosaurs are believed to have lived, a small amount of textual information on each dinosaur and three or four scanned graphics of dinosaur.

HS25 - Farm Animal Stack

This stack was developed by the father of a five year old child who is developmentally disabled. It is appropriate for the age range of 2 to 4. Farm Animals has pictures of common animals and sounds. The stack has been adapted to be used with a Unicorn expanded board/AFC as well as the Touchwindow.

HS26 & HS27 - The Civil War

This two-disk HyperStudio stack is a summary of the causes, beginning, major leaders, major battles, and conclusion of the Civil War. The graphics were created with a Quickie scanner, and there are some really good battle sound effects and music. The HyperStudio run-time module is included.

HS28 & HS29 - Monticello

HS42 - Reading Stacks


